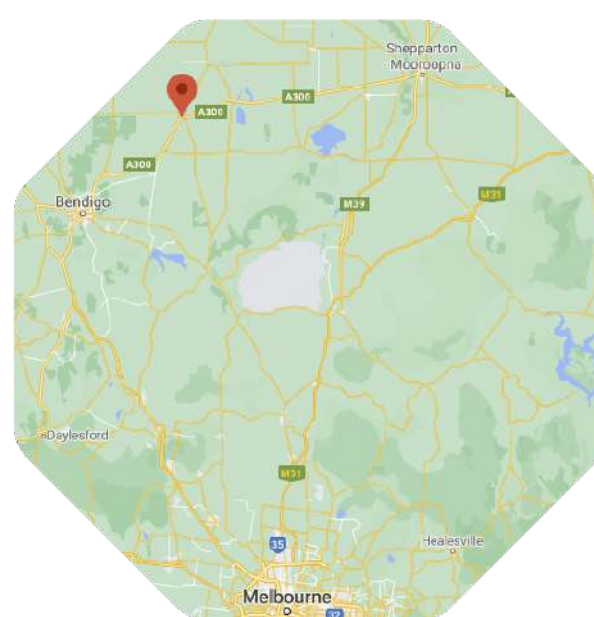

Where is it being held?

The event will be held at the Elmore Field Days site. Elmore is a small town (population 776), north of Bendigo on the Campaspe River. The Elmore Field Days site is 154 hectares, including buildings and an airstrip.

Elmore hosted the 21st Australian Jamboree in January 2007 and we've chosen this site again because:

- We know it really well
- There's lots of useful infrastructure
- It has abundant water
- It is central to a great range of activities
- There's good camping on flat, green paddocks



What's different this time?

We expect the total cost of attending will be the same or less than last year.

The cost will cover all transport, accommodation, food, facilities, a Jamboree roller bag, daypack and hat, plus a huge range of awesome activities both onsite and offsite. And this year, there will be some offsite activities that involve staying overnight!

We're keeping the costs right down, so there will be a much smaller Contingent Headquarters team than we've had in the past, and all merchandise will be created centrally. This also ensures we have consistency in the materials and sustainability of all items, which is one of our primary aims for 2022.

Finally, you'll see elements of the Youth Program embedded throughout the event, which will help Groups who are already on the journey towards the new Program, and should entice those who haven't yet kicked off their journey to feel confident about its benefits and value.



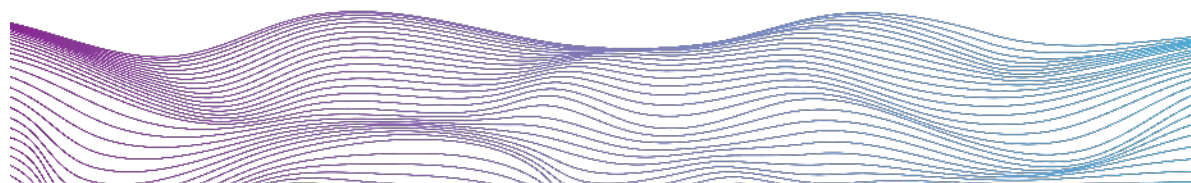
Who is eligible?
