



## Scouts NSW Pleasurecraft Group Insurance Facility

Scouts have established a pleasurecraft insurance program through our insurance broker, Aon to assist groups to insure their pleasurecraft and boating equipment similar in function to how trailers are insured.

Groups who own pleasurecraft may previously have included the value of their boats and boating equipment under their Contents declaration. This provides cover whilst the boat and equipment is stored at your hall but not whilst in transit or in use.

The pleasurecraft insurance program provides cover whilst the boat (hull, motor, trailer and accessories) is stored, in transit and whilst in use. Groups who insure their boats and boating equipment under the pleasurecraft insurance policy can remove the value from their Contents declaration.

The volume of boats and boating equipment owned by Scouts will allow for competitive rates to be obtained and ensure consistency of cover across all Scouting property. The following is a summary of key aspects with Scout pleasurecraft insurance facility:

<b>Basis for settlement (what value should you insure for?)</b>	Pleasurecraft (includes hull, motor, trailer and boating accessories) should be declared based on their market value which is the basis of settlement, subject to the limit of the declared sum insured
<b>Excess</b>	\$200 each and every claim
<b>Sporting equipment</b>	\$1,500 limit per item up to \$10,000 maximum limit (note that value of equipment/accessories needs to be factored into the declared overall sum insured. In the event of a total loss, overall claim will be limited by the declared sum insured.
<b>Yacht racing risk extension</b>	Yes, for races up to 50 nautical miles. Insurance cover for longer races is available upon request and approval by insurer.

Scout Group pleasurecraft policies will be paid by Scouts Branch and recovered from the group through the Asset Management Fee process.

## **Inboard Powered and Moored Pleasurecraft**

Pleasurecraft insurers will require periodic boat inspection reports for both inboard and moored pleasurecraft which would need to be separately rated and managed outside of the pleasurecraft facility.
