

50. MAKE A MASK

Type of Challenge:

This is an Individual Challenge. Each member of your Patrol must complete this challenge and you must submit an image of each Patrol member wearing their mask.



Resources Required:

- Round plate – 26cm (or 10 inches) in diameter
- 30cm square piece of fabric – cotton-blend is best
- Scissors
- Sewing needle
- Cotton thread
- 2 hair elastics/ties

NOTE: This cloth face mask is not intended to replace a N95 mask as it will not protect you at the same level. By sewing in a small pocket inside the facemask, you can add a filter to offer greater protection than is provided by just two layers of cotton-blend fabric.



To complete this challenge, you need to take a photograph of you wearing your mask and send it to your Patrol leader.



MAKE A MASK - Photo Instructions

Step 1. Layout the fabric and draw around the turned-up plate.	Step 2. Cut around the circle.	Step 3. Fold the circle in half with the 'right side' of the fabric facing outwards.
		
Step 4. Cut up the fold.	Step 5. Pull apart the two sections.	Step 6. Face the two right sides together.
		
Step 7. Sew around the curved edge of the fabric.		Step 8. Open the two pieces so the other edge is sitting flush against the other side.
		
Step 9. Sew around the new edge.	Step 10 Leave open the last 4cm.	Step 11. Turn the mask the right way out by pulling the mask through the hole you've left (above), then neaten it up.
		



Step 12. Make the edges crisp by flattening them with your fingers.



Step 13. Prepare your mask to have the elastics attached at the side corners.



Step 14. Fold over a corner of the mask so it holds the elastic.



Step 15. Sew the corner down to hold the elastic.



Step 16. Stretch out your mask so it's ready to wear.
