


The biggest annual global celebration of Scouting is coming up on 1 August, so get your scarf out that day! The idea is that all active and former Scouts wear their scarves in public to make the "Spirit of Scouting" visible: Once a Scout - Always a Scout! The date of the event commemorates the very first Scout Camp on Brownsea Island in England in 1907 which you can learn about here.

At a local level, World Scarf Day is a great opportunity to promote your Group and talk to potential new members about Scouts. For example, school children can ask their principal and teachers if they can come in uniform (or just the scarf) and talk to the class or assembly about Scouts.
