#### **ClubGRANTS - Category 3 Infrastructure Grants**

If your Group has got a building project of over \$10,000 in mind, consider applying for this grant. The program funds construction, alteration, renovation, completion and fit-out of buildings and community infrastructure to deliver outcomes for disadvantaged communities in NSW, including those in regional, remote and drought-affected areas, or for culturally and linguistically diverse, disability-focused, Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander or disaster-affected communities.

#### **Risk Assessment Form update**

To streamline our approach to risk management, the Scouts NSW Risk Assessment Forms have been consolidated into a single document. The new *Risk Assessment Form* now aligns with the national safety criteria from Scouts Australia (as featured on *Scouts Terrain*). This means we now have a single form that accommodates the *5x5 Risk Matrix*. Therefore, there is no longer a form with a *3x3 Risk Matrix*. You can find the new form under Health and Safety here.

To reflect this change, there have been minor changes to the *Work Health & Safety (WHS) Risk Management Procedure.* We have also introduced *WHS Risk Tolerability Criteria* in NSW – rated as extreme/high/medium or low (as there is no related criteria at the Scouts Australia level). #### **Australian Scout Promise**

With the sad passing of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, we have updated the *Australian Scout Promise*. There are two versions and individuals may select which version they wish to make. For those who choose to pledge allegiance to a monarch, there has been a single change in the wording from 'Queen' to King' as shown below:

On my honour I promise that I will do my best To do my duty to my God, and To the *King* of Australia, To help other people, And to live by the Scout Law.

#### Aspiring Trainer's Program

Calling all young people who are interested in training others! If you have knowledge on how to apply the Youth Program in a Unit setting, then the Aspiring Training Program (ATP) might be for you. The Program offers coaching, mentoring and formal skills development, and is designed to help participants grow personally and professionally in their skills to deliver training and conduct assessments of a variety of Scout Training Curriculums and Programs.

The Program will run until 31 March 2023 and continue to run in 12-month periods thereafter. Adult leaders and Rover Scouts must hold a current *Wood Badge* and *Certificate of Appointment Youth Program Leadership*. All suspicions, concerns or allegations about criminal matters or child protection matters should be reported directly to the Chief Commissioner, the Deputy Chief Commissioner (Youth Safety, Compliance and Support), the CEO or the Child Protection Officer at the Scouts NSW Service Centre.
