Heading high into the hills, in July we hosted our Scouts Ambassadors, Drs Gareth Andrews and Richard Stephenson, for a final training session in the Snowy Mountains, before they set off for the icy plains of Antarctica to attempt the **longest ever unsupported ski crossing of Antarctica** (2,023km). Our Scouts were able to learn the art of snowcraft from these intrepid explorers, as well as having the opportunity to hone these skills at a State Alpine School in August.

Reaching for the skies, literally, in June we celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Air Activity Centre with an open day for Scouts and the local community.
