2023 Scouts NSW Annual Membership Fees

WELCOME TO THE 2023 SCOUTING YEAR!



Read on about your Scouts fees & new validity period for **Active Kids vouchers**

Read on for details on your Scouts fees & new validity period for Active Kids vouchers.

- Scouts NSW annual membership January December starts now
- The State membership fee is \$270 for the year
- This covers 'Trek 1' (1 January-30 June: \$167.50) and 'Trek 2' (1 July-30 December: \$102.50)
- Your first Active Kids voucher can now be claimed and used (expires 30 June 2023) • A credit of \$67.50 per member from 2022 applies if continuing in Scouts this year
- Returning members using Active Kids voucher and this credit pay zero for 'Trek 1'
- Invoices will be sent from 1 February, with one month to pay any amounts owing
- You may also receive an invoice for local Group Activity Fees · Please make sure we have your correct contact details

Youth Safety in Scouting

Scouts NSW is committed to operating as a youth safe organisation and implementing youth safe policies and practices in accordance with the elements of a child safe institution outlined by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse report entitled Creating Child Safe Institutions.

Remember

All suspicions, concerns or allegations about criminal matters or child protection matters should be reported directly to the Chief Commissioner, the Deputy Chief Commissioner (Youth Safety, Compliance and Support), the CEO or the Child Protection Officer at the Scouts NSW Service Centre. Imminent Danger

If someone is in danger NOW, the matter should be reported directly to NSW Police on 000. Where a report is made to the Police, you must also subsequently notify Scouts NSW Service Centre.
