## GRANTS

### Volunteer Grant Funds Distribution

The Grants Team is working hard to connect our Volunteer Grant Application records with relevant grant funds deposited by the Department of Social Services in July 2023. Unfortunately, there is one amount for \$16,500 from the Stronger Communities Grant Programme, which does not have an associated Grant Reference Number, so the team needs your help to determine who should receive the funds.

## MEMBER SERVICES

Group Leaders were reminded in an email from Chief Commissioner Lloyd earlier this month that any existing members who have not yet registered through ScoutHub have been removed from ScoutLink. This means those members will also have been removed from our other systems, including **Operoo**, **on-demand training** and **ScoutsTerrain**.

Members who are not registered through ScoutHub are not able to participate in any Scout meeting, activity, or event.

It is important to work together to ensure all Groups are compliant, particularly from a youth protection and risk perspective, as unregistered members are now non-compliant and uninsured.

Should these members wish to re-register, they can reactivate at any time by completing a returning member registration for Trek 2 within ScoutHub.

## POSITIONS VACANT

### National Council Nominations

Scouts NSW is seeking five candidates to represent NSW on the Scouts Australia National Council. Three positions are for one-year terms, two of whom at the time of appointment are aged under 30. The other two positions are for three-year terms.

National Councillors are expected to vote on issues affecting the national body of Scouts Australia with the interests of both Scouts Australia and Scouts NSW in mind. Meetings are held on at least one occasion per year, with NSW Councillors generally meeting by teleconference prior to National Meetings to review any items requiring decisions. Nominations close at 5pm, Sunday 3 September.
